



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Give each student a strip of coins. They color them, cut them out and glue them to the matching box on their hat. When you print these, print on a little darker setting so the faces show up. If you print as is they might be a little light.

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This is the cover for the "Cent-sational Seuss hat. Run off and cut on the lines. Remind students to stop cutting when they get to the dashed line. Fold the dashed-line tab and staple it to the front of the hat. These look more "Seussical" if students color every other stripe red in an ABAB pattern.

Run the hat off on white construction paper.

Have students color every other stripe red, in an ABAB pattern BEFORE they glue their coins on. If you think this is too much coloring, run off the cover on red construction paper, distribute the stripes, so that students will still be making an ABAB pattern. i.e. Some students will start by gluing a red stripe down first, and others will have their second stripe be red.
